### PBH 7903 Global Health

(2 credit units)

The global nature of public health issues across the domains of practice is of growing importance. Chronic disease problems such as obesity and its consequences as well as communicable disease such as HIV/AIDS, malaria and TB are of international concern. So too are the health effects of international policies and trade agreements. In addition, public health has a key role to play in disasters such as earthquakes, floods and Tsunami. This course will introduce a global perspective to non –and communicable disease; the inequalities between nations; the impact of the wider environment on health; response to disasters; the role of international bodies.

- To gain awareness of issues in global human health and security
- To understand major measurements of the health of populations and its determinants
- To have the ability to interpret the reasons for health changes and variations of the world and its nations
- To obtain skills in accessing, compiling and presenting the health situation of any country

### PBH 8000 Public Health Law

**(2 credit units)**

This certificate will be run in conjunction with CUHK School of Law. This course aims to examine the role that law and lawyers play in protecting the public health and in promoting health. This will require an understanding of principles of common law, administrative law, public law and of the legislation which purports to regulate the public health. It will require consideration of the constitutional limits of the state's power to impose public health interventions on individuals, and of principles of human rights and ethics which serve to protect the rights and dignity of individuals in the context of public benefit. The course will also address the role of the international community in protection of national and global public health.

### Learning Outcomes/Objectives

- This course aims to examine the role that law and lawyers play in protecting the public health and in promoting health. ## Module: Clinical Trials

Course Coordinator: Prof. Benny Zee

### PBH 7506 Clinical Trials

(2 credit units)

This course will cover basic design and conduct of controlled clinical trials with adequate sample size, proper randomization technique, blinding procedure, choice of control arm and the counting of relevant events. Attention will be given to the problems of conducting clinical trials in both single center and multi-center. Topics covered will include formulation of research questions, drafting of protocols, design of case-report-forms, logistics of data flow, methods of follow-up, data management and quality control, periodic reporting, final data analysis, and the production of final reports. Ethical issues and the role of randomized trials in clinical investigation will be discussed.

#### Learning Outcomes/Objectives

- To understand the advantages and disadvantages of various designs in clinical research
- To understand the concepts of randomization in controlled clinical trials
- To be able to develop a protocol for a clinical trial to address the research questions
- To have a general knowledge of the statistical issues commonly encountered in clinical trials
- To be aware of the ethical issues in clinical trials
- To have an appreciation of the Good Clinical Practice (GCP) requirements in the operation of clinical trials
- To learn some basic elements of data management and quality assurance in multi-center clinical trial set up

### **PBH 7909 Medical Sociology/Anthropology**

**(1 credit unit)**

Medical sociology is the sociological study of health, illness and medicine, examining the production of disease and the cultural meanings of illness, the social organization of the medical care system, the impact of technology on health, the social meanings of genetics, and new conceptualizations of the body and health. Areas of discussion include the influence of ethnicity, gender, age, or socioeconomic status on the access to and quality of health care; health and risk taking behaviors; social constructs of illness; health beliefs and perceptions; health effects of sociocultural changes; the social implications of biomedical innovations, education, and communication; and other sociological aspects of medical organization and practice.
